Cultural dimensions help us analyse and compare cultures systematically.

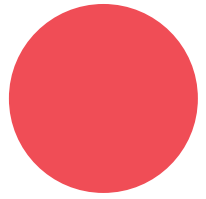
They highlight key differences in cultural values and practices.

Understanding these dimensions helps us navigate cross-cultural interactions and foster global cooperation.

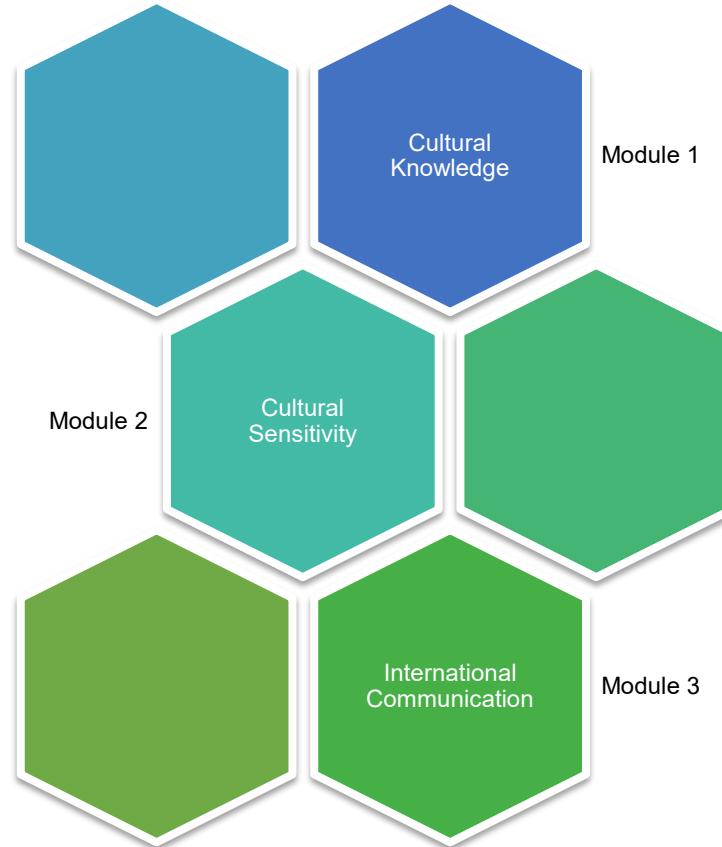
Hofstede's Cultural Dimensions:

- **Power Distance:** Degree of acceptance of unequal power distribution.
- **Individualism vs. Collectivism:** Preference for individual or group orientation.
- **Masculinity vs. Femininity:** Value placed on competitiveness versus care.
- **Uncertainty Avoidance:** Comfort with ambiguity and risk.
- **Long-Term vs. Short-Term Orientation:** Focus on future rewards or present benefits.
- **Indulgence vs. Restraint:** Gratification of desires versus regulation by social norms.

Definition: The set of behaviours, attitudes, and policies that enable effective work in cross-cultural situations.

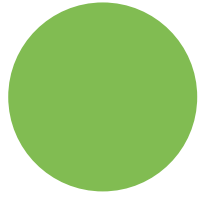


What is Cultural Competence?
